So the woman left her water jar and went away into town and said to the people, "Come, see a man who told me all that I ever did. Can this be the Christ?" They went out of the town and were coming to him. John 4:28-30

He told me everything I ever did! It amazes me that the woman Jesus met at the well was so shocked that Jesus knew every detail of her life that it changed her life. It wasn't raising the dead or walking on water that blew her mind. She clearly was astonished that Jesus knew her, the good and the bad, the things she has done and the things that had been done to her and spent meaningful time with her at the well.
