I Surrender! Pastor David Seabaugh Immanuel, Elmhurst

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. James 4:7

It's not something you expect to hear from someone on the winning team. However, teams that win have to surrender their own plan in favor of the coach's game plan. As followers of Jesus, we have confidence that victory is ours through Him. We also look back upon a long tradition of surrender. In fact, the only way to true victory is through surrender...and refusing to surrender.

God calls us to the more difficult way of trusting Him through the trouble and submitting to the way He chooses for us to take.

Even our Lord, Jesus Christ, had to totally surrender Himself to the purposes of His Father, while resisting the temptations of the devil to take a path other than the cross. Think of Jesus praying in the Garden of Gethsemane hours before he would be tortured and killed for our sins. Jesus was fully human. He could have come up with a different plan, one without so much pain. He didn't. It wasn't in the Coach's game plan. The Coach's game plan was written long before Jesus was born on this earth. It called for Jesus to suffer in our place so we could have eternal victory. I don't know about you, but I'm grateful Jesus stuck with the plan.

The challenges and opportunities of modern-day Christianity echo those of the past, with a 21st century flair. Like Moses lifting his hands toward the Red Sea, or Jesus submitting Himself to God's will, we can draw inspiration from those who gave themselves over to God only for Him to prove again and again that He is the source of life and goodness.
