Prisoners

Edmond Dantès was falsely accused of being a traitor and imprisoned on the island of Château d'If. He remained a prisoner for fourteen years until he was able to escape with the help of a fellow prisoner.

His fellow prisoner teaches him many things and the last thing he taught him was to not commit the crime for which he has been falsely imprisoned (if he should ever escape). He tells him that vengeance is God's.

When Edmond tells him that he doesn't believe in God, his friend replies, "It doesn't matter. He believes in you" (2002 film version of *The Count of Monte Cristo*).

Set Free

We are all prisoners of some sort. Sometimes we are held prisoner because of our own sinful actions.

Sometimes we are imprisoned through no direct fault of our own – disease, circumstance, and so on.

But God sets each of us free from our prison!

Jesus Sets Us Free
