

## About this study

Dear Friends in Christ,

COVID-19 changed the world! It brought suffering, death, and grief to countless people as God's gifts in front-line workers and first responders did their best to maintain life and quickly seek solutions to protect the public through the vaccinations that have now become a part of our lives.

Another challenge that the pandemic brought was to our social structures.
